## WORK STREAM (WS) 1: RESEARCH/ DATA

• Country update (to date): 22 countries on board

**Regional hubs:** In 2025 three regional hubs were launched: (1) South and East Asia (SEA); (2) Latin America and the Caribbeans (LATAM); (3) Africa. See figure 2.

- Ongoing studies (2024-2025):
  - Epidemiology of CP in LMICs: All affiliated registers are collecting data on core variables, including socio-economic status, risk factors, timing and cause of CP, motor severity, associated impairments, and rehabilitation.
  - Early detection and early intervention: Developing a multicountry research protocol on early detection and intervention for children with CP in LMICs, aiming for publication in BMJ.
  - Country-specific research: Ongoing studies on early detection, community-based rehabilitation, nutrition, and quality of life in several countries.
  - Publications (2024-2025): 14 articles published, 4 under year 2026.
    review, 12 to be submitted to DMCN in 2025 as part of an LMIC paper series.

#### WS 2: RESEARCH TRANSLATION/ SERVICES [2024-2025]

- Community of practice (CoP) for early detection and early intervention for children with CP in LMICs: 10 LMICs participating; over 2,000 high-risk infants will be screened using GMA and HINE with a standardized protocol.
- Wheelchair distribution: Malawi (x166), Vanuatu (x8), and Bangladesh (x42) CP Registers.
- Community-based rehabilitation: Ongoing in Bangladesh (n=234), Uganda (n=328), and Malawi (n=30).

- GMA/HINE Training: As part of the regional investigators meeting, 70+ professionals will receive GMA and HINE training in LMICs.
- GLM CPR Webinar Series: In 2024, we had 6 webinars, 183 participants from 19 countries joined. In 2025, we have 5 webinars scheduled.
- Epilepsy management training: 35 professionals trained in Malawi, 40 to be trained in July 2025 and 20 are on the waiting list.
